Place to visit: Ise Jingu (Shrine) · Mikimoto Pearl Island

Recommended schedules: 8:00-18:00

<b>Example</b>	08:00 Meet with guide at Nagoya Station and take train to Toba 10:00 Mikimoto Pearl Museum (Ama Diver's Demonstration from 10:20) [70 mins] 12:15 Take bus to Ise and have lunch Visit Naiku and enjoy strolling Okage Yokocho & Oharai Machi [180 mins] 18:00 Take bus&train and end tour at Nagoya Station

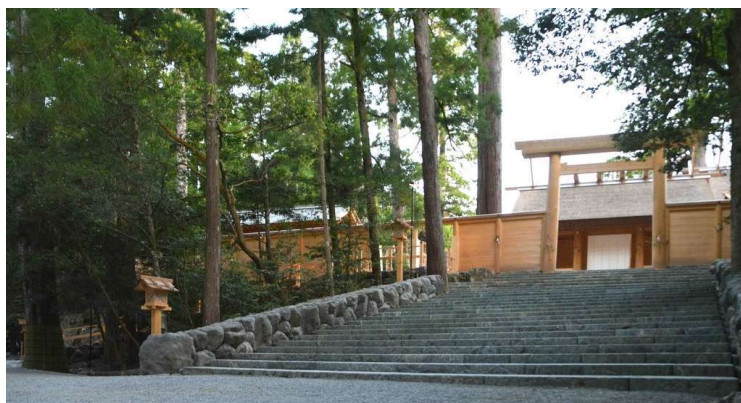
## ☆ Mikimoto Pearl Island

Mikimoto Pearl Island is an excellent museum about pearls, pearl cultivation and Mikimoto Kokichi, a pioneer who first succeeded in cultivating pearls. The island is located in a bay of Toba, accessible via a bridge. It also offers hourly performances by female pearl divers, known as ama, who have traditionally been planting and harvesting oysters (and other seafood).

- Open hour : 9:00~16:30
- Ticket : 1,500 JPY (750 JPY for age under 12)

## ☆ Ise Jingu (Shrine)

Ise Jingu, officially 'Jingu', includes 125 shrines, centered around Kotaijingu (Naiku), dedicated to Amaterasu-Omikami, and Toyouke-daijingu (Geku), dedicated to Toyouke-no-Omikami. The area is roughly the same size as Center of Paris. More than 1,500 rituals are conducted here yearly to pray for prosperity of the Imperial family, peace of the world and huge harvest.



## ☆ Okage Yokocho & Oharai Machi

Okageyokocho Lane is located in Oharaimachi area near Naiku shrine zone. Built from Edo era to Meiji era, this small alleyway extending across 13,200 square meters has relocated and reproduced some historic Japanese architecture. It's a kind of theme park where you can slip back to Japan of hundreds year ago. You can look for specialty souvenirs such as yasunaga rice cakes and akafuku, and enjoy strolling around gourmet restaurants associated with Mie Prefecture.
